# Prayer of Confession

Many have used "lost" and "found" language to create a damaging dichotomy that Christians are found and non-Christians are lost. But the truth is, each and every one of us is a little bit lost and a little bit found from time to time. Each and every one of us needs the love of the Good Shepherd.

Join me as we go to God in prayer.

Merciful God,

C: We confess that we are like lost sheep.

L: We wander from your path, following our own desires instead of Your voice.

C: We stray in thought, word, and deed,

L: sometimes without even realizing how far we've gone. Forgive us, Lord.

C: We confess, too, that we are slow to seek those who are lost.

L: We turn inward, caring for ourselves while ignoring the hurting and the forgotten.

C: Our hearts grow cold to the very ones You call us to love. Forgive us, Lord.

L: Open our eyes to see the lost. Open our hearts to care for them. And when we ourselves are lost, remind us that you never stop searching until You find us.

C: Amen.

Nicene Creed
